From the Pastor's Desk...

Greetings children of God.

We have begun my favorite time of the year, the holiday season and Christmas. I have many fond memories of this time of year: cutting snowflakes out of paper and taping them to our living room windows, baking and decorating cookies with my mom, walking miles with my dad through snow that was knee deep or more (at least it seemed like miles), looking for that perfect Christmas tree, decorating our tree, and finally, barely sleeping on Christmas Eve as the anticipation of Christmas morning was palpable.

As I grew older, I began to develop a better understanding of Christmas and the "reason for the season" if you will, the birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. And like many, I still get caught up in focusing on the manger, and the baby born there, especially when singing Christmas carols, like Away in a Manger, Silent Night, Hark the Herald Angels Sing, Good Christian Friends Rejoice, etc. And that's ok. The hope God promised came to the manger in Bethlehem, but that hope was sealed on Golgotha's cross. During this Christmas season, celebrate the birth of Christ, relish in it, enjoy every moment with family and friends, but remember, our hope doesn't stop at the manger, that's only where it began. Because of the cross and our baptism into Jesus' death and resurrection, our salvation is in his hands, and for us and all, that's good news. May God bless you and yours this Christmas.


GIBSONBURG AREA CHURCHES PRESENT THE 2024 DRIVE-THRU

THE INCARNATION

At the center of Christmas is Jesus, both fully God and fully man. "In Bethlehem, humility and glory in their extremes were joined," wrote pastor R.G. Lee (1886-1978). When Jesus came to earth, Lee explained, he descended:

- from the heights of glory to the depths of shame,
- from the wonders of heaven to the wickedness of earth,
- from exaltation to humiliation,
- from the throne to the tree,
- from dignity to debasement,
- from worship to wrath,
- from the halls of heaven to the nails of earth,
- from the coronation to the curse,
- from the glory place to the gory place!

"Born in a stable! Cradled in a cattle trough! Wrapped in swaddling clothes of poverty!" Lee wrote. "No room for him who made all rooms! [No] place for him who made and knows all places! Oh, deep humiliation of the Creator — born of the creature, woman! But in his descent was the dawn of mercy. Because we cannot ascend to him, he descends to us."




A GLORIOUS HOPE
