From the Pastor's Desk...

Greetings children of God.

One of my favorite contemporary Christian songs is *The Lion and The Lamb* by Big Daddy Weave. Aside from it being just a great, uplifting song, I truly love the chorus as it draws us in to see Jesus, our Lord and Savior, in the image of both of those animals. Until April 20, we journey to the cross with Jesus, singing with other disciples, serving those in need, and giving God all the praise. We journey to the cross, finding out again that only in the death and Resurrection of Jesus, do we find life, hope, and joy. Jesus is the Lion. He is the Lion of Judah, the leader of God's people from before the beginning of time. As an apex predator in creation, the lion symbolizes strength, leadership, and majesty. In the C.S. Lewis series, the Chronicles of Narnia, God was portrayed as the lion, "Aslan." It's the Lion who protects us from Satan. It's the Lion who keeps us safe, and it's the Lion whose very appearance is majestic.

<u>OHIO SUMMER YOUTH RETREAT</u> – Save the date: <u>June 29th-July 2nd</u>. This year, there is going to be a statewide youth summer retreat at <u>Hopewood Pines (LMC)</u>, in Marengo, OH, which is about 1 1/2 hours south of us. This will include youth from all three synods. If you have a child that will be entering 6th grade through 12th grade next school year, they are eligible to attend.

The retreat will be from Sunday June 29 to Wednesday July 2. Check in is June 29 from 2:30-4:30 and check out is Wednesday July 2 at 1pm. There will be programming, worship, and campfires. And the youth will be able to sign up for activities like kayaking, low ropes, archery, climbing wall, hiking, ziplining, etc.

We would need at least 1 adult per every 10 kids, and it would be great to have 1 male and 1 female leader, but that's not an absolute. Each adult will need to have an updated background check done. The kids will be grouped together in cabins. I'm guessing by age but I do not have that information yet. <u>The deadline to register is tentatively set for May 31</u> but since the camp can only accommodate so many people at a time, the sooner we can register, the better. The cost is \$150 per youth and will be paid for by Faith Lutheran Church. Adult chaperones are free. If this is something your child would be interested in doing, or if you would be interested in being an adult chaperone for this, please let Pastor Tim know as soon as possible. CHURCH COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS – MARCH 18, 2025

- Discussion regarding the leak in the ceiling of the men's bathroom – Damschroder Roofing was called in to inspect the roof and found no evidence of a leak. Next step is to have Zimmerman Construction open up the wall to search for the cause of the leak.
- Discussed age of existing roof (installed in 2007 and out of warranty). Options for eventual replacement include new roof or a coating. Costs and warranties vary and will need to be addressed in the future.
- Spring clean-up scheduled for April 5th depending on weather. Alternate date is April 12th if necessary.
- Engineers have been contacted regarding design plans for the • proposed door/ramp project.

EARTH-SHAKING VICTORY

On Ash Wednesday in 2001, a 6.8 magnitude earthquake shook the Seattle area. Charlie and Ann Lewis, co-pastors in Snohomish, Washington, reflected on the timing:

"While most years we prefer to think of Lent as a contemplative journey of faith as we walk with Jesus toward Jerusalem and the cross, this year we are thinking of how God turned the world upside down at Calvary. From the cross, Jesus cried out with a loud voice, and his life was finished. Then the earth shook violently, the curtain in the temple was torn in two and rocks were split apart. The God who identified with us in our humanity in the incarnation of Jesus Christ demonstrated in that moment the depth of divine love for us — a love that leads God to choose the path of suffering and sacrifice.

"Three days later, the earth shook again — another violent earthquake, and the stone in front of the tomb was rolled away. Then the crucified Christ threw aside the burial cloths, emerging from the darkness of the tomb to walk in the dew of the grass as dawn was breaking across the sky. God had declared victory over sin and death itself. That victory was for us. ... God has given us a glorious life that extends into eternity."


