From the Pastor's Desk...

Greetings children of God.

March is upon us, and so is the season of Lent. March 5th is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. The season of the year where we focus on our sins and all the ways we fell short of God's glory. The season of the year where we journey with Jesus to the cross, and his death, a death that should be ours. It's a solemn time. We don't like being wrong. We don't like making mistakes. We don't like being the sinful creatures that we are, and when we are faced with our sin, we withdraw into ourselves. When we are reminded of our sin, especially in such a tangible way as on Ash Wednesday when our foreheads are marked with a black, ashen cross, we can't help but feel the shame associated with our failures.

But March is also the time of rebirth. In the month of March, Spring begins. Days grow longer and nights grow shorter as our part of the world starts to awaken from its winter slumber. The bright green leaves of daffodils and tulips begin to break through the surface, and not long after that, the beautiful, vibrant flowers begin to bloom. It's a time of rebirth. This reminds us that Lent is a season that only lasts five weeks. And it reminds us that, as the Apostle Paul wrote, in Romans, "while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." So, while our sins are before us, while we will spend the next several weeks reflecting on our shortcomings, while we will come before God with repentant hearts, we will also be able to rejoice.

And we are able to rejoice because of our baptism, our rebirth into Jesus. Yes, we are in the season of Lent, but we know the story. We know that Jesus died on the cross, was buried in the grave, and that he rose on the third day, leaving all our sins in the grave forever. And in our baptism, we have been washed clean of those sins. In our baptism, we have been claimed by God as his beloved children. In our baptism, we have been made heirs with Jesus, and we have been connected to his death and resurrection, thereby giving us the gift of eternal life! Lent is an important time. It's imperative that we take this time to slow down, reflect on our lives over the last year, look at the areas where we fell short of God's glory, review our sinful moments, and come to God in honest repentance for what we've done. And then it's just as imperative that we give God thanks and praise for sending us a Savior who did what we couldn't do. With repentant hearts, we give thanks and praise to God for Jesus, crucified and risen for the world.

<u>OHIO SUMMER YOUTH RETREAT</u> – Save the date: <u>June 29th-July 2nd</u>. This year, there is going to be a statewide youth summer retreat at <u>Hopewood Pines (LMC)</u>, in Marengo, OH, which is about 1 1/2 hours south of us. This will include youth from all three synods. If you have a child that will be entering 6th grade through 12th grade next school year, they are eligible to attend.

The retreat will be from Sunday June 29 to Wednesday July 2. Check in is June 29 from 2:30-4:30 and check out is Wednesday July 2 at 1pm. There will be programming, worship, and campfires. And the youth will be able to sign up for activities like kayaking, low ropes, archery, climbing wall, hiking, ziplining, etc.

We would need at least 1 adult per every 10 kids, and it would be great to have 1 male and 1 female leader, but that's not an absolute. Each adult will need to have an updated background check done. The kids will be grouped together in cabins. I'm guessing by age but I do not have that information yet. <u>The deadline to register is tentatively set for May 31</u> but since the camp can only accommodate so many people at a time, the sooner we can register, the better. The cost is \$150 per youth and will be paid for by Faith Lutheran Church. Adult chaperones are free. If this is something your child would be interested in doing, or if you would be interested in being an adult chaperone for this, please let Pastor Tim know as soon as possible.

CHURCH COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS - FEBRUARY 18, 2025




* Finalized Dinner Church plans for Lenten services. A light meal will be served followed by a skit-based service followed by discussion opportunities.

* Reviewed annual congregational meeting including a discussion of the member response and ranking of proposed projects. Council will continue efforts to obtain information on the highest ranked projects which include handicap automatic door openers for entry doors, new exterior doors for the narthex and new entry way by fellowship hall to include ramp accessibility and awning.

* Discussed proposal to LIFT VBS inquiry that Faith will host 2025 VBS if it is acceptable to do in the mornings, due to lack of adequate air conditioning later in the day. LIFT will consider the needs of its prospective participants. If it is determined that VBS needs to be held in the evenings, then it will probably be hosted elsewhere.

* Faith has accepted a request to host the NWOH Synod's Affirmation of Vows for the rostered leaders of the Synod. Event is scheduled for April 15th. Faith will provide a hospitality team to assist with the event. Council members will be part of this team.

TESTING WEEKS - We are continuing our partnership with Atkinson Elementary this year as the students in grades 3-5 approach state testing. The testing begins the last week in March and extends through the first week of May. The Faith Mission and Outreach Committee is again asking our congregation to help by purchasing snacks for the students during those testing weeks.

During the school day, many students eat their lunches earlier in the day and then require a snack later in the afternoon. Mr. Ward, the principal, said that the teachers often provide a small snack for the students to eat. Some of the snacks may include **PRETZELS**, **LANCE PEANUT BUTTER CRACKERS**, **GOLDFISH CRACKERS**, **FRUIT SNACKS**, **CHEEZ IT CRACKERS**, and **GRANOLA BARS**. These treats need to be in <u>single prepackaged units</u> for sanitary reasons. A display will be set up in the narthex of our church showing the variety of itams needed. A basket for monetery denotions is also available if

THE LENTEN DESERT

During the Lenten season, which begins on Ash Wednesday (March 5 this year), Christians figuratively follow Jesus into the desert. Just as our Savior spent 40 days fasting and facing temptation, we focus on self-reflection and contrition.

In an 1873 hymn, Claudia Hernaman wrote, "O Lord, throughout these forty days, you prayed and kept the fast. Inspire repentance for our sin, and free us from our past."

The desert experience of Lent serves a clear purpose, filling us up rather than depleting us. "This is what Lent is meant to be," writes

theologian Ron Rolheiser. "Time in the desert to courageously face the chaos and the demons within us and to let God do battle with them through us. The result is that we are purified, made ready, so the intoxicating joy of Easter might then bind us more closely to God and each other."

FASTING AND FEASTING

During Lent, consider this practical — and biblical — advice from Arthur Lichtenberger, a former presiding bishop of the Episcopal Church:

- Fast from criticism, and feast on praise.
- Fast from self-pity, and feast on joy.
- Fast from ill-temper, and feast on peace.
- Fast from resentment, and feast on contentment.
- Fast from jealousy, and feast on love.
- Fast from pride, and feast on humility.
- Fast from selfishness, and feast on service.
- Fast from fear, and feast on faith.



Resting in Jesus

An old hymn declares: I heard the voice of Jesus say, "Come unto me and rest. Lay down, O weary one, lay down your head upon my breast." I came to Jesus as I was, so weary, worn and sad.

I found in him a resting-place, and he has made me glad. (Horatius Bonar, 1846)

Many people these days feel exhausted by division, the news, hatred that seems louder than love. More than ever, we who are "weary, worn, and sad" need to hear Jesus say, "Come unto me and rest."

Jesus wants to be our resting place — but not so we can hide forever from reality. Instead, he offers a place of refreshment where we can relax long enough to remember that not everything is bad; there is gospel to share. Not everything is hatred; God's love is stronger.

Resting in Jesus, we focus on God's goodness. We are reminded of love shown by kind people to those in trouble, bold voices speaking for justice, warm friendships that brighten our days. Gladdened by rest, we rise again. Jesus walks with us, as always. We can lean on him every step of the way.
