From the Pastor's Desk...

Greetings children of God.

June is upon us. We are just over half-way through the liturgical year and are entering the longest season of the church year, the Time after Pentecost. And it's no surprise that it occurs during the summer months, as this is the time of year that is symbolic with growth. Farmers planted their crops in mid to late spring and during the summer, these crops experience exponential growth. And along with the farmers' crops, the flowers, vegetables, and fruits many others plant in their gardens experience this same exponential growth.

During the Time after Pentecost, the color green is used to indicate our growth, in our faith and as disciples of Jesus, as we follow his teachings and ministry through the coming months. Just as farmers tend to their crops, and others tend to their gardens, protecting them from weeds, insects, and disease, doing all they can to encourage growth and increase the fruits of their labor, we Christians need to do the same. As we work to grow our faith and increase the fruits of our labor as disciples of Jesus, we also need to take care to protect ourselves from the weeds, insects, and diseases Satan tries to corrupt us with. We do this by spending time in prayer daily, by reading God's Word daily, by coming to worship regularly, and by listening to God, which is probably the most difficult for us to do, especially with all the "noise" we face each day from the world.

To listen to God is to daily consider and acknowledge God's everlasting love for us, to quiet our minds to pay attention to what God is saying to us individually and collectively, to recognize God's great power, to trust God's guidance and follow God's instructions. God, in Jesus Christ, is continually seeking to be in relationship with us, loving us and guiding us, but if we're not listening, we miss God's presence, connection and constructive guidance that's available to us for the living of these days.

As difficult as it may seem for us to do this, we are able to listen to God. We just have to be intentional about doing it. "Incline your ear, and come to me; listen, so that you may live..."

PROJECTS UPDATE - CGS was contacted about new doors for the narthex entrance. They verified that they are not able to install automatic openers on our current doors because they are all glass. To have an automatic opener installed on the doors for the narthex, we would have to get new doors (which are needed) that have some metal framing around them to house the mechanical parts needed for the automatic openers. They have doors available with smaller framing on the top and sides, that are half the size of the framing on the entry doors by the fellowship hall. The bottom of the door would be the same as the doors by the fellowship hall. The cost for the new doors is \$8,809 and the cost for the opener to open both doors is \$6,323, for a total of \$15,132. The council discussed this and agreed it would be better to get the new doors for the narthex and the opener for them first and then get the opener for the doors by the fellowship hall. The Handicap Accessibility Dedicated Fund currently has \$10,235 in it. This leaves us needing \$4,897 before that project could begin.

We had a leak in the ceiling of the men's restroom. Damschroder Roofing was here to inspect the roof in late February/early March but found no leaks. Upon their inspection of the roof, they noted that it is 3 years out of warranty but that it still has a few years of life left. They provided 2 quotes. The first quote was for "seal coating" the existing roof. This would cost \$42,000+ and would carry a 10-year warranty. The second quote was for a new roof that would cost \$153,000+ and would have a 20-year warranty. Since the current roof was installed over the previous roof, both would have to be removed before the new roof could be installed. They also said they would make any necessary repairs until we had the money to have the new roof installed.

We contacted Technique Roofing Systems in Helena for a second quote. When they inspected the roof in early May, they found a hole in the corresponding area where the leak is in the ceiling of the men's restroom. They immediately had a technician come out and weld a patch over the hole. After their inspection, they said the roof should last for another 5 years. They recommended not putting a seal coat on the current roof. Their quote for a new roof is about \$94,000 and it will have a 25-year warranty. Since the current roof should last about 5 more years, this gives us time to raise the money for the new roof. If we inform Technique Roofing that we intend to go with them for the new roof, they will inspect our roof every year and will address any issues or

make any repairs to ensure we won't have any issues until we have the money to have the new roof installed. The council discussed this and agreed that we should go with Technique Roofing and will be recommending this to the congregation

Another project that will need to be done next year is to have the parking lot seal coated. The last time it was done, it cost about \$10,000 and the same company estimates the cost would be \$10,744. Updated quotes will be requested when it's time to do that project.

With having to have the roof redone, this does slow down the process for the new entry way by the fellowship hall and for updating the sound system in the sanctuary. Looking at the next five years and considering the projects we need to have done and would like to have done (new roof, seal coating of the parking lot twice as it needs to be done every 3-5 years, updated sound system in the sanctuary, and a new entry way by the fellowship hall), the total cost for these projects is estimated to be between \$225,000 - \$250,000, and over a 5 year period, this cost may very well increase. This does not include any other maintenance or the repair of any other issues that may arise. The building and improvement fund currently has about \$50,000 in it. That leaves us needing an additional \$175,000 - \$200,000 (or \$35,000 - \$40,000 per year for the next 5 years) to reach the amount needed to complete all of our projects. The council will be discussing potential fund-raising projects to help us reach this goal and we will keep the congregation informed of everything along the way.

We will be scheduling a special congregational meeting for the council to provide their recommendation for the narthex doors and opener for congregational approval, and for the roofing contractor.




NOISY OFFERING UPDATE -
