From the Pastor's Desk...

Greetings children of God.

Ah, the month of July. The time of year when we celebrate our nation's independence. It's also the month that unofficially marks the middle of summer. It's a time of year known for gatherings of all types, cook-outs, birthday parties, weddings, anniversary parties, family reunions, and any other reasons we can come up with to get together with family or friends to enjoy the warmer temperatures and the longer days. It's also a great time for Christians to embrace our call as disciples of Jesus. At the end of Matthew's Gospel (28:19-20), after Jesus' death and resurrection, Jesus commissioned his disciples, "Jesus said, 'Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

On the day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit filled Jesus' disciples and enabled them to speak in languages they previously couldn't and all those gathered in that place, which was a mix of people from all walks of life, were able to hear the Gospel, the Good News of Jesus Christ, proclaimed to them in their own language, and because of this, over 3,000 were baptized that day. Several months ago in a sermon, I shared how a parishioner's grandson, who had dealt with some significant issues, shared his faith with his football teammates and how many of those young men, who had never gone to church, began going to church, and how several of them made the decision to be baptized. He wasn't walking through neighborhoods, going door-to-door. He simply took the opportunity after practice and told his teammates who Jesus was to him.

I'm sure some of your family and friends are Christians and go to church. But I'm also sure there are some in your circle who aren't and who don't. The tremendous opportunity to share your faith, expand

God's kingdom, and have an overwhelmingly positive, and life-changing effect on someone's life lies before you. Now is the time to grab hold of that opportunity instead of making excuses not to. Now is the time to be that vessel for God. Now is the time for you to step out in faith at whatever gathering of family and friends that you're at, trusting Jesus' promise that he is always with you, and boldly take the opportunity before you to share your faith, knowing that the only things we truly regret in life are the risks we don't take. How many could you lead to being baptized by doing so? There's only one way for you to find out.


