From the Pastor's Desk...

Greetings children of God.

November is a month of thanksgiving. We carry over from the end of October our thanksgiving to Martin Luther and his faithful witness to the grace of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, which was the catalyst for the Reformation. We begin November by giving thanks for all the saints who have come before us and are now in heaven with God, and we give thanks that one day, we will join them. We give thanks for a plentiful harvest. And we give thanks for God's handiwork as we revel at the colors of the leaves and the changing of the landscape, as our part of the world prepares to shift from fall to winter. 
