#### From the Pastor's Desk...

Greetings children of God.

Each year, my wife and I look forward to <u>Christmas</u>, and the opportunity to decorate the house. I think I get that from my mom, who started decorating our house in the middle of November. For me, once the Thanksgiving holiday passes and the tree and decorations are up, I spend a lot of time reminiscing about past Christmases. One tradition many people follow is the use of an Advent calendar. As a child, I saw it as an opportunity to get a piece of candy on each of the 24 days leading up to Christmas. But now that I'm older, my appreciation for the Advent calendar has grown along with my understanding of its meaning. <u>Advent means</u> "the coming of Christ." For Christians, the four weeks leading up to December 25 are an opportunity to recognize the significance of Jesus' birth and <u>prepare our hearts and minds for his second coming</u>.

A great place to figure out what Advent should look like is the story of Jesus' birth in <u>Luke 2</u>. In <u>Luke 2:10-11</u>, an angel declares to the shepherds, "I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the city of David a Savior has been born to you: he is the Messiah, the Lord." Out of God's great love, he sent his one and only Son to earth as a gift for us. Jesus came, lived a perfect life, died on the cross for our sins, and then overcame death. Because of Jesus, we have life, hope, joy, and peace.

For Mary and Joseph, there were no rooms available. They had to find a place for Jesus to be born. If we aren't equally as intentional about making a place for Jesus in our lives, the next four weeks fly by, and Christmas will be gone. The holiday season is a chaotic time. There's parties and gatherings to plan and attend, and there are presents to buy, all in addition to the normal responsibilities of everyday life. Slowing down to spend time with God takes effort. If we want to have time to

reflect on all God has done and prepare for all God wants to do in the future, it's imperative that we make it a priority to spend time with God.

When the shepherds heard of Jesus' arrival, they stopped tending their flocks and hurried to visit him. As soon as they saw him, they made known what had been told to them about Jesus and as they returned to their fields, they praised God and spread the good news that Israel's long-awaited Savior had arrived. This Advent and Christmas, let's follow their example by celebrating the gift of Jesus with everyone we can. As we gather with coworkers, friends and family, be sure to share with them how the birth of Jesus over 2,000 years ago is still impacting our lives today and invite them to experience Jesus for themselves.
