From the Pastor's Desk...

Greetings children of God.

Have y'all ever been to a mall or an amusement park and as you're trying to figure out how to get from where you are to where you want to go, you stand there a bit perplexed as you try to figure out exactly where it is that you are? And then you find that one large map of the area and it has a big red "X" or an arrow with the words, "**You are here now.**" That's kind of where we are right now as the church, Faith Lutheran Church that is. Let me put it to you this way, if you were to invite someone to church, what reason would you give them? We have good music and a good pastor. We're very welcoming. We have all the pieces to do some outstanding, almost mind-blowing ministry here; we just have to put all of the pieces together, and rest assured we will do our best to do so. May God’s Spirit and blessings be upon us as we begin this journey.

TESTIMONIES FOR USING TITHELY.COM TO “GIVE” TO OUR CHURCH

I started using Tithely about a year ago while we were still holding church virtually/drive-in. I was only watching online which meant I was hardly ever physically at the church to make a donation. Even when I was, I could never remember my envelopes or money to put in them. That really bothered me so I made an account, which was incredibly simple, and just planned on giving that way until we went back to in person church. However, the simplicity of using the website/app has been so nice, that I have just kept using it. I set up a recurring payment that pulls automatically and then sends me an email confirming my donation. By using Tithely, I don't have to remember envelopes, cash, or the next time I'll be at church to give. The money just pulls from my account once a week and I'm done. But I do have the option to change the amount I give or how often I give at any time. I absolutely love the convenience of this app and knowing that I'm still contributing to our church, even when I'm not physically there. If anyone is interested in trying the website/app out and wants more information, feel free to reach out to me! Alexis Schneider

I was looking for a way to pay the church online for over a year. Then the church came up with a new program through Tithely. I can do this any time of the day. I do not have to do it before I come to church and be late. The church even sends me an email receipt every time.

When we decided to revamp the website in May of 2020, it became apparent that we needed a way for people to give to the church that was connected to our website. We did a little research and found Tithely to be effective. I was actually the first person to give through Tithely to our church as a test maneuver. It was so simple. I just followed the “Give” button on our homepage at faithfremont.org (our website) and typed in what I wanted to do. I set it up to be recurring for a set amount each week. I didn't do this at first, but then realized it made a lot of sense not to have to worry about it anymore. You have the option to pay the small fee or to have it come out of your total donation. You can designate what fund you want the money to go in to and everything. It really is very simple to do and then you don't have to think about it anymore. You don't have to write the check the night before or that morning and then remember to bring it with you and to put it in the collection plate.

It's one less envelope that the counters have to handle that Sunday also, not that that is a big deal, but if we all do it, then it would be a pretty big deal. I would like to say that before setting it up as recurring, I had it put on my credit card verses taken directly out of my bank account, and the fee is a bit higher if you choose to use a credit card. The weekly receipt to my inbox reminds me to enter it in my check register. Please consider using this new and convenient way to give to your church. There have been less than 6 people who have used it so far, even after almost a full year of having it, and it really is a great resource tool to help you in your giving. Think about what believers today might miss if we neglect to worship with other friends of Christ. Who would want to miss God's blessings, promises and joy?

LOVING AN "EGR"

During a conversation over coffee, a friend mentioned an "EGR." I had to interrupt and ask for a definition: Extra Grace Required — in other words, people who can seem tough to love. Even corrupt tax collectors do that much" (Matthew 5:46, NLT).
